

## Student Uniform Policy

***This policy addresses issues in relation to:  
Safe and Supportive Environment – Student Welfare 3.6.2***

***(See also Policy on Behaviour Management)***

As an independent school, Al-Faisal College has a designated school uniform worn by all students at all times. Parents and students are advised of the uniform and procedures in order to purchase the various items at the time of enrolment and are reminded and updated through the school newsletter and app. The full school uniform is also detailed in the school diary.

The school uniform must be purchased from the official Uniform Shop (FAZ Uniforms: 15/364 Park Road Regents Park NSW 2143).

### **Unofficial uniforms and logos are not accepted at the College.**

School hats or caps are also a compulsory part of the school uniform (K-6) and recommended for (7-12) students.

Only black leather enclosed formal school shoes are approved. Slip-on shoes, open style shoes, canvas shoes, sport shoes and high heels are **not** permitted.

Students must wear the full school uniform in the correct manner when travelling to and from school. The uniform must always be neat, modest and well presented. Dirty, torn or damaged uniforms are unacceptable.

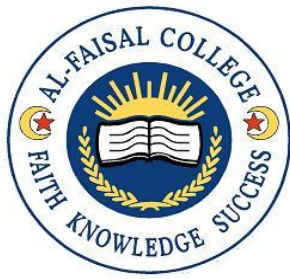
### **Personal Hygiene**

Students must be well presented at all times. Girls with long hair must have their hair tied up and from Year 4 onwards must wear the Hijab.

Boys must have a short, plain haircut of even length, all over (no undercuts, hair products or extreme hairstyles) and their shirt tucked into their trousers. Fingernails must be kept short and clean.

The only forms of jewelry permitted at school are wristwatch for boys and girls and stud earrings for girls. No other body piercing is permitted.

No form of makeup is permitted at the college.



## Procedures

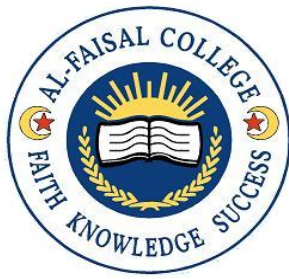
If for any reason a child is out of full school uniform for a day, a note from the parents must be sent to the school justifying the reason. This should be presented to the classroom teacher (primary) or roll call teacher (secondary). The Coordinator (primary) or Faculty Coordinator and Welfare Assistants (secondary) should also be notified.

Sanctions or penalties may be imposed if the correct uniform is not being worn:

- In minor cases the Coordinators (primary), or or Faculty Coordinator and Welfare Assistants (secondary) may warn the student in the first instance for wearing incorrect uniform and negotiate a date by which the correct uniform is purchased and worn appropriately.
- Students wearing jewelry apart from wristwatches and stud earrings (girls), will have the item confiscated and returned to the parent only. They will also incur an after school detention. (secondary)
- When significant parts of the uniform are not worn correctly, the Coordinators (primary) or or Faculty Coordinator and Welfare Assistants (secondary) may contact parents and the student may be sent home to correct their uniform.
- Should students continue to wear incorrect uniform their parents will be contacted by the Coordinator (primary) or Faculty Coordinator and Welfare Assistants (secondary) and an after school detention or a suspension issued. The student may be sent home to correct their uniform.
- Students who still do not wear the uniform may be excluded from class and their parents contacted. The student's place at the school will be reviewed by the Head of College.

Students and their parents have the right to appeal these decisions through submissions to the Head of College / Executive Principal.

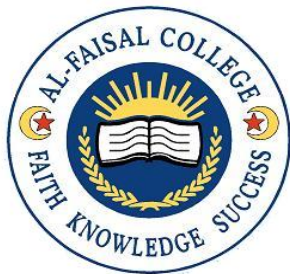

Only black leather, formal lace up shoes are permitted at school for both boys and girls.

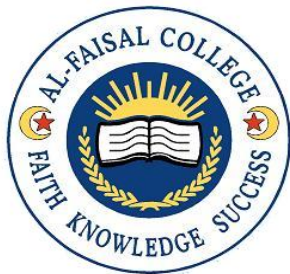
